### REFLECTIONS FROM THE CO-CHAIRMEN.....

What a great success! When Mary Durland first approached us to co-chair a 150-year celebration of Johann and Catherine Schuenemann arriving in Johnsburg, Illinois, it seemed to be an impossible task. Our first question was simple: "How do we even find everyone?" Of course, the answer is now history. Mary spent years researching the Schueneman history all the way back to Ochtrup, Germany in 1848. She found nearly 1000 descendants spread across more than fifteen states and three countries on the North American continent. Every major branch of the family was represented at the reunion.

It was a grand event. The weather in Northern Illinois was perfect. Individual families gathered in advance of the reunion to visit, reminisce, play, and eat together. The Saturday golf tournament was a fun event for young and old. Who would believe that we have a family member that can drive a golf ball more than 350 yards! The dance following the tournament was a great ice-breaker for the family -- and our relatives from Mexico showed everyone how to really cut the rug.

On the morning of the reunion we began with registration, coffee, and more conversations from everyone. Over 250 were in attendance, and we were grouped as families by the names of the children of Johann and Catherine. In attendance were 84 descendants/spouses of the John Schuenemann & Minnie Kuhnert clan, 17 descendants/spouses of the George Schuenemann & Louise Geisler clan, 63 descendants/spouses of the Elisabeth Schuenemann & Bernard Kristan clan, 2 descendants/spouses of the Katherine Schuenemann & Ben Dowe clan, and 90 descendants/spouses of the Albert Schuenemann & Barbara Fagel clan.



Being Sunday, the official events of the day started with a Mass across the street at the historic St. John the Baptist Church, directly next to the cemetery where the graves of Johann and Catherine Schuenemann are located. Later in the day, we reconvened in the church for a special presentation of the history of the church and cemetery given by Father Bob Balog. At the end of his talk, he led us all in singing a moving rendition of a patriotic song.

Our ages were quite varied, cutting across six generations. We had a brief ceremony with a short history of the family in America given by George Kauss and Harry Durland Griffith, followed by lots of fun and games for youth and adults. We played Shoe Toss, Softball, 3-Legged Races, Horseshoes, Water Balloon Toss, and Tug-of-War.

Looking back on the event it is easy to see that all of the committee work (see back cover of booklet) was a complete success. We were amazed at the diversity of our family, but also at our similarities. We represent the entire cross-walk of occupations, ambitions, and aspirations of the great American people we have become. It was obvious to see that as family members we each appreciate the value of our company and the love of parents, siblings, children, uncles, aunts, and cousins past and present. We are a family that has a sense of humor, a sense of history, and above all else, we know how to say we care about you, mean it, and live it. We are proud to be members of the Schueneman family.

# Far-flung family

## Schueneman clan celebrates 150 years of life in United States

JOHNSBURG -- Many American family trees branch across the ocean just two or three generations back.

But the Schueneman family planted its roots in the Chicago area seven generations ago.

The family celebrated the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the family's migration from Ochtrup, Germany, with a family reunion Sunday at the Johnsburg Community Center.

The site was selected because the couple who started the family tree in America are buried in the cemetery at St. John the Baptist Church, which is across from the park.

Farmers Johann Heinrich Schuenemann and Maria Catherine Greitenevert settled in Johnsburg 145 years ago after working five years as laborers in Chicago.

"They came over to make their fortunes like everybody else," family historian Mary Durland said.

The couple had eight children, five of which resulted in 999 descendants

from the original Johnsburg couple.

The 1,000 mark soon will be reached because three women at the reunion are expecting.

"I had no clue how many relatives I had," said Scott Smith of McHenry. "It's kind of overwhelming. I thought I had a big family as it was."

It was Durland's genealogical research that inspired the family reunion and brought about 225 relatives out to Johnsburg. Durland, who lives in San Antonio, traveled to Germany several times and talked with relatives to trace the rich history of the family.

Many met for the first time. Some of the older ones remembered one another from Schueneman family picnics in the early 1960's.

Marcella Schueneman, 85, won the award for the oldest person at the reunion.

"Even though I was the oldest, I felt great," she said. "It was fun meeting all the people I've known for years and haven't seen."

The relatives came from as close as McHenry County municipalities and the Chicago area to as far away as British Columbia and Mexico City.

But not one from the hometown. The closest relatives live in McHenry.

The reunion took more than a year of planning.

Tracing the relatives was a chore itself, but the family pulled together. They even went as far as producing a 1998 Schueneman Family Reunion Web Page.

The day was filled with talks about family history, games, food, and friendship.

"In a world where there's so much rootlessness, to see the ties and renew the bonds gives us a greater sense of history," said Betty Schueneman Beyer of North Chicago.



Durland Griffith (Lake Forest, IL), Co-Chair of the 1998 Schueneman Reunion, gives us a "tour" of life through the seven generations of the Schueneman family. In his talk, he tells how the first generation of Schuenemans "came to America seeking economic opportunity, searching for religious freedom, carving out individual communities in the early unsettled American wilderness." From the second generation (the heads of the five families honored at the reunion), "who were children during the Civil War and lived during the Great Age of Invention," through the fourth generation, "who were young during the Depression and defeated Germany and Japan in WWII," the family grew. The fifth generation Baby Boomers were the "first to hear the words 'pizza' and 'McDonald's' and fought in Vietnam."



To the sixth and seventh generation descendants, he said "You are the future." Special recognition was also given to all the descendants' spouses, who were thanked "for enriching our family with your traditions."

Some of the individuals recognized included the attendees having the most children (Betty Beyer – N. Chicago, IL), most grandchildren (Joan Larkin – McHenry, IL), and youngest mother (Alison Beyer – Pontiac, IL).


